Life in a circus - circus facts

- 1 Every child knows and loves a circus tents, trapeze artists, lions, tigers, horses,
- 2 clowns, fascinating tricks and the smell of cotton candy in the air. Most circuses
- 3 provide their own electrical power, large circuses have their own schools, cafés,
- 4 stores, laundry and even pastors for Sunday services.
- 5 But how is life in a circus? A circus is like a small town that moves from one place
- 6 of exhibition to the next. In past years and still today, some circuses move every
- 7 day. That's seven towns a week and two performances a day. Others stay at one place for one or two weeks.
- 8 From the opening in spring until the closing in fall there are usually no days off. You will rarely hear of a show
- 9 person taking a sick day, the old saying "the show must go on" certainly applies to circus people.
- 10 Circus life is not an easy one. There are storms, cold, heat, mud, injury and months away from home. Still, if you
- 11 ask any life-long showman the question "Why do you do it and why not find another job?" he will answer: "I'll
- 12 never give up show business! We do it for a love of the business, of the traditions, of the culture and a love of
- 13 the circus."
- 14 And what about the children? Growing up in the circus means that every member of the family is part of the cir-
- 15 cus right from the very beginning. Playtime often serves as a training for circus children's future careers. In ad-
- 16 dition, children have their own duties that must be performed daily. Circus children can't attend normal schools
- 17 constantly. So often they are home-schooled by a parent or a designated person. Their progress is monitored
- 18 closely by a school authority.
- 19 There are dangers connected with being on the road like strong storms. A circus tent is no place to be in a
- 20 thunderstorm or high winds. Showpeople have to monitor the weather closely and know when dangerous con-
- 21 ditions may arise. When people watch a circus performer walking on a thin wire forty feet above the ground,
- 22 they may think there are many injuries and deaths due to performing mistakes, but that is far from the truth.
- 23 Accidents are extremely rare.


