4) Überprüfe, ob die Geschichte auch an anderen Orten auftaucht

- Überprüfe, ob die Nachricht von mehreren dir vertrauten Nachrichtenseiten publiziert wird.
- Je häufiger die Nachricht auftaucht, desto wahrscheinlicher ist sie wahr.
- Greife auf Informationen von vertrauenswürdigen Organisationen wie beispielsweise Reuters zurück.



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
