1. Fun Easter celebrations

Easter is the oldest and most important Christian festival. For children in Germany, Easter is also about fun activities like looking for candy-filled eggs and meeting the Easter bunny. However, not everyone celebrates this important holiday with these traditions.

- 1** On the Thursday before Easter, Swedish children dress up as witches and go door to door to get sweets in exchange for handmade Easter cards and drawings. The custom dates back to an old story about witches, who meet on a small magical island on the Wednesday before Easter. There, they plan tricks and return to Sweden on the holiday. It is unclear how the old story led to this fun Easter tradition, but Swedish kids are not complaining.
- 2** In Norway, the Easter holiday week is actually 12 days long. Norwegians love spending these days reading crime novels or watching crime series. Every year, you can find lots of new thrillers in book stores to satisfy people's appetite for Easter crime. Television stations fill their daily programmes with crime dramas and even dairy companies publish illustrated crime stories on their milk cartons.
- 3** In the southern French town of Haux, residents and visitors gather in the town's main square every Easter Monday to share a massive omelette. It is cooked by members of the Giant Omelette Brotherhood. They need over 15,000 fresh eggs and it is big enough to feed as many as 10,000 people. According to the legend, while travelling through the region, Napoleon Bonaparte stopped at the small town for a meal. The French Emperor enjoyed the omelette so much that he returned the following day and asked the townspeople to gather all their eggs and make one big enough to feed his entire army.
- 4** Hundreds of visitors from all around the world travel to Corfu, Greece, every Easter to witness an ancient custom. It involves residents tossing out large pots or pans filled with water from their balconies onto the streets. It is a tradition to welcome spring, symbolizing the new harvest that will be collected in new pots. This fun tradition very likely came from Venice, where people throw out dishware every New Year's Eve to show they are ready for a fresh start.
- 5** Every year on Easter Monday, residents in Poland go outside for a friendly water fight. It is called Wet Monday. The fun water battle is followed by parades and parties, with celebrations often extending into the early hours of the following morning. Not surprisingly, the "refreshing" custom has been adopted by countries and cities worldwide, including Buffalo, New York, which is home to a big Polish-American community.

2. Tips for preventing sports injuries

- Tip 1** When kids get hurt, some of them are tough and ignore the pain. This can lead to a more serious injury. If you're feeling pain or something that just doesn't seem right, talk to your parents or your trainer. They will know what's the right thing to do or who to ask.
- Tip 2** A physical test is a great way to find out if you are fit for training or playing. It helps to check an athlete's fitness before starting an activity. It keeps them from getting a more serious injury.
- Tip 3** There are kids today who play the same sport in two different teams. But it is important for kids to switch between different sports or activities. This way they make sure that they train different muscles and don't use the same ones too much.
- Tip 4** Athletes of all ages need to have breaks between practices, games and events. In fact, many injuries come when you do too much sport and don't get enough rest. Make a training plan to give your body enough time to recover. It is also important to have a longer time of rest during two seasons.
- Tip 5** It's important for athletes to eat a well-balanced diet full of fruit, vegetables and proteins. It's also important to have a regular eating schedule. Have breakfast, lunch and dinner at about the same time each day. In summer, on hot tropical days, you should make sure you drink enough water before, during and after training. Watch for any signs which show your body is reacting to the weather in a negative way, including tiredness, or feeling sick.
- Tip 6** Protective equipment, like helmets, pads and shoes, are very important for injury prevention. For example, do not use shoes designed for indoor sports when you play a sport outdoors. Do not go road-cycling either without making sure that your bike is in perfect condition.
- Tip 7** In every sport, there is a correct way and a wrong way of doing things. If you don't learn how to practice a sport correctly, it might stop you from getting better at some point. For example, football players should be taught the proper way of tackling an opponent to avoid injuries. A basketball player should use the correct method to throw the ball.
