1. Stan the dinosaur gets a new home

- 1 Stan is one of the world's largest and most complete dinosaur skeletons. In 2020, the Tyrannosaurus Rex (T. Rex) skeleton was sold in an auction for a record 31.8 million dollars. The skeleton was bought by an anonymous person. Therefore, many scientists thought that the T. Rex would end up in a private collection forever. Luckily, they had nothing to worry about.
- In 2025, the new Natural History Museum will open in Abu Dhabi, which is the capital of the United Arab Emirates. Stan will then become a star attraction in this brand new museum. The museum will be one of the largest of its kind in the world and visitors will be able to learn about the history of the Earth.
- 3 Now that Stan has a new home at the Natural History Museum Abu Dhabi, this 67-million-yearold dinosaur will be in the care of expert scientists. The skeleton will be important for education and research and also inspire future explorers. Students can come to the museum and, while learning about Stan, imagine their own future as a scientist.
- 4 The skeleton was named after Stan Sacrison, the hobby scientist who found the skeleton in 1987. First he thought that it was a plant-eating Triceratops dinosaur. It was only after scientists examined the bones more closely in 1992 that the true identity was discovered. It took over 30,000 hours to fully restore the T. Rex. However, the effort was well worth it.

- Stan's 188 bones are about 70 % of the total skeleton. His almost complete skull is the best T. Rex skull ever discovered. When he was alive, Stan was 11.7 metres long and weighed between seven and eight tonnes, or about twice as much as an African elephant. The cause of his death is not known, but the T. Rex was probably about 20 years old when he died.
- Stan will not be the only star attraction at the new Natural History Museum though. It will also show a famous meteorite. The Murchisan Meteorite crash-landed in Australia over 40 years ago. It is about seven billion years old, which is about 2.5 billion years older than the Earth. It has helped scientists to learn more about the Solar System.

- **Tip 1** It's all about the light. Pay attention to the shadows created by the sun and the way light reflects off buildings. Experiment with taking photos during the "golden hour" shortly after sunrise or just before sunset. Observe how the light changes inside a room at different moments.
- 5 **Tip 2** When you use your smartphone camera's digital zoom, you lose a lot of fine detail. Often, the images come out blurry. Instead, try taking just a few steps towards your subject and see if your picture improves. You will be amazed by the difference of picture quality.
 - **Tip 3** You will take better pictures if you try different angles: Take pictures from rooftops or ladders, lie down on the ground or move to the side to change your point of view. Try as many angles on your subject as possible.
 - Tip 4 There are many apps available on your phone that can help you edit your photos. Maybe they cannot fix problems like poor lighting, but they can improve other details of the image and allow you to add text or effects. Find a photo app you like, learn how to use it well, and you can improve the quality of your images.
- With smartphones, we are able to take pictures on the go. However, the cameras on our phones are still sensitive to movement. To avoid blurry photos, hold your camera steady. You can lean on a friend or a wall to stop your arms or hands from shaking or prop up your phone using books or similar objects.
 - **Tip 6** Your phone is probably with you most of the time. This means that you can take great photographs anywhere and anytime. So, instead of taking just one photo of a subject you're interested in, take 10, 20, or even 30 photographs. Then spend some time looking at your pictures to see which ones you like best, and why. The more photos you take, the more comfortable you will get.
 - **Tip 7** Your phone's camera does not have a cap to protect the lens from fingerprints and all the dirt in your pockets. This can lead to bad images that can't be fixed later. Buying a lens cloth can help. Even wiping the lens with your T -shirt is better than nothing.


